4. Chair Report - Glenda & Erin

a. Jacket Racket - November 6-17 - collecting child, youth and adult sized winter clothing (jackets, snowpants, hats, mitts/gloves) in good condition at ROS (large bin at front doors, otherwise students can bring donations to the classroom and Grade 4's will have a leadership opportunity to go classroom to classroom to collect donations) for drop off Nov 19 to be distributed to Calgary students in need.

5. Treasurer's Report - Laura

- a. Current balance of \$8,957.39, an increase of \$625.50 from the last statement.
- b. Paid out \$20.00 for the September volunteer appreciation gift card. Net profit of \$210.50 from the Cobs fun snack and a donation of \$435.00 from YYC Food Trucks for our welcome back Picnic in the Park event.
