- a. Additional Parent Concerns/New Business
 - Miranda asked: What day in December is best to bring in "Teacher Appreciation" items? Michelle said any day of the last week of school, but perhaps Wednesday works best. Michelle estimates 44 staff (teachers + support staff).
 - Miranda asked for \$500 from the Staff Appreciation budget. Erin motioned to approve \$500, Glenda seconded. All in favor, none opposed, motion passed.
 - ii. Planning ahead for Literacy Month and what to do with funds raised, Lissa brought up the Little Red Reading House (LRRH) van that comes to schools and reads to kids. Idea to have the van come to the school to read to classes and allow kids to explore the van plus giving each child a book. LHHR generally caps each school at 2 days of visits with 6 classes per visit, but LHHR suggested giving a few books to each classroom and holding shorter reading sessions as a compromise to accommodate our large numbers.
- iii. Issue raised about KidStart (a before and after school program) bus driver is currently putting cones out in the morning to save space is there any way to accommodate these buses? Answer: in short, no, our current bus space is simply not long enough to fit more than our CBE buses. Suggestion made to have these buses park a little bit further away and walk a block or two with students.
