### 2. Principal's Presentation

- a. Acknowledgement of the Land
- b. Gratitude: Thank you to the School Council and Fundraising Society for ongoing support & holiday treats shared with staff. Thank you to volunteers for photo retakes, field trip, and fun lunch. Thank you for the plant fundraiser efforts.

- b. January Agenda: motion to approve by Lissa, seconded by Carole. All in favor, none opposed, motion passed.

### **4. Chair Report - Glenda**

- a. What to spend \$500 grant on – needs to be used for resources/families/parent event for the school; needs to be used by June; (potentially combine with another school for a guest speaker?)
  - i. Paul Davis (William Pratt) – Internet safety; may be middle school oriented/not age appropriate
  - ii. Institute of Psychology – resilience, self-regulation, anxiety, etc.
  - iii. Gym rental free on Thursdays if booked as a school event
- b. Read-a-thon prize: partial funding from community and partially funded by parent council; Little Red Reading Van won't work for all students to have a visit and get a book
- c. "Meet our council and fundraising team" wall (create and plan to have up for March conferences or even Board game night)
- d. Needing to fill previous positions
  - i. E.g. Glenda & Lissa both leaving this year
- e. New positions
  - i. Instagram.
- f. For future need, there is a "School Booking How-To" currently saved in the council drive → references
- g. School Board Trustee – Jenny Regal; wants to attend a meeting/event at ROS

**5. Treasurer's Report - Laura**

- a. Current balance of \$10,114.69, an increase of \$1,694.27 from the last statement.
- b. We paid out \$202.41 for seminar/curriculum (including \$111.16 for Fresh Fruit Friday and \$91.25 for literacy luggage supplies), \$303.69 for holiday teacher appreciation, \$20 for volunteer appreciation, \$50 for Ms. Dawson's farewell gift, \$25.90 for welcome back picnic supplies, and \$97.00 in advance for board game night prizes.
- c. We had a net profit of \$373.07 from the Subway Fun Lunch.
- d. Winter dance raised \$1,033.60 for the school! Total net profit for month (less gym rental paid in advance last statement) is \$2,020.20
  - i. Worked better to have dance on one night
  - ii. Next dance book only one gym/not back gym.
- e. Because of strike, profits from HH will be down (last year 15 @\$300 avg each); spring dance may be opportunity to make-up for these funds.

- b. Hug & Go - Candis – Volunteers out first week of January. Parking concerns remain but it is difficult to find volunteers to commit to these shifts. Larger/heavier pylons (previously approved) have not yet been purchased; need to plan logistics for where they will be placed and if they need to be moved. Candis put in requests for improving crosswalk markings/visibility to City.
- c. Events
  - i. Family Board Game Night (Jan 29<sup>th</sup>) – Goal is community-building night/keep ticket cost low. HH charges customer \$0.30 + 1.5% and also charges 4.5% to council; Sign-Up will be used for registration instead. Entry by donation at door to raise funds for school (suggested donation of \$2/family).
    - Tables & chairs set up in gym can seat up to 150ish
    - 50 slots per time for signing-up (5:00-6:00pm and 6:30-7:30pm)
    - Volunteer Sign-Up separate
    - 10 board games; families to also “Bring Your Own Board Game” or puzzle.
    - Game trade table
    - No concession; water bottles only

- Square & cash box need to be set-up for donations
- 3 prizes for each group; by raffle
- Parents must attend/supervise children
- Invite to go out next week (via teachers Google classroom & Principal's email)
- ii. Literacy Month in March
  - March 1 to 18 – book drive: drop off in classroom or at front office
  - March 19/20 – book sale; volunteers on the Friday may be difficult TBC
  - Calgary Library Night participation
  - Dress-Up Day – author or character
  - March 16-19 – hand in read-a-thon forms
  - Requests going out to businesses for prizes
  - Request volunteers for literacy month in Council Corner
- iii. Fresh Fruit Friday March 6
- iv. Staff Appreciation
  - February – kindness month; student participation kindness toward teacher (e.g. postcards, drawings) TBC

## 7. Funding Requests

- a. Lissa requesting funds for literacy month; \$1,500 for expenses (E.g. prizes, packages, bookmarks, thermometer for days/minutes complete). Motion to approve by Lissa; seconded by Carole. All in favor, none opposed, motion passed.
  - i. Concern that prizes should be equitable (collective vs. individual). Past prize for individuals reading most/per grade and classroom prize for who raises the most. All children who handed in sheets considered. But some forgot/did not do it at home and did not get prizes.
  - ii. Additional \$1,200 from curriculum budget to be used for literacy month. Motion to approve by Laura and seconded by Glenda. All in favor, none opposed, motion passed.
- b. Teachers will have budget oversight on the prize money to be used on literacy initiatives/resources (up to \$100/classroom).
  - i. Little Red Reading House (LRRH) van that comes to schools and reads to kids, offers tours & gives each child a book. Cost is approx \$200 for 2-3 classes. Capacity/cost issues for entire school.

- Offer to Kindergarten classes **only** for a total of \$400 as their literacy month prizes; 75 children for two separate visits
- Need to approach LHHR with dates ASAP for spring (May/June)

- Volunteer Summary & Thank You's - **Thank you to the 39 volunteers that helped out with our 3 events in December** - Fun Lunch, Photo Retake Day, and Winter Dance. **At these events there were 6 people who volunteered for the first time this year!**
